Guidelines for PRQ Book Reviewers

To help prepare your book review for publication, please adhere to the following guidelines:

- Book reviews submitted to PRQ should conform to the style requirements of US English, according to The Chicago Manual of Style, 17th edition. Spelling and hyphenation should follow Merriam-Webster's online dictionary. Citation and referencing style should follow Chicago's author-date system.
- A review of a single title should be approximately 800 words. Overlong submissions will be edited to length.
- The bibliographic description of the book under review should conform to one of the following examples, where applicable. Adapt the single-author monograph style for multi-author teams, using <u>Chicago's style</u> as a model. Include print and ebook editions as relevant.

For a single-author monograph:

Ross G. Forman. 2013. China and the Victorian Imagination: Empires Entwined. Cambridge Studies in Nineteenth-Century Literature and Culture. Cambridge: Cambridge University Press. x + 300 pp. US\$149.95. Hardback. ISBN: 978-1-10-701315-5.

For an edited volume:

Kendall Johnson, ed. 2012. Narratives of Free Trade: The Commercial Cultures of Early US-China Relations. Hong Kong: Hong Kong University Press. xi + 272 pp. US\$50. Cloth bound. ISBN: 978-9-88-808353-4. Also available online, e-ISBN: 978-9-882-20927-5.

- The book review should include a brief description of the contents of the book, an evaluation of the strengths and weaknesses of the treatment of the topic, and an overall assessment of the book.
- Quotations must be indicated in parentheses in the body of the text. A parenthetical reference must include the author's last name, a space, the publication year, a comma then the page number or numbers; for example, "(Ahmed 2021, 73)". Instances in which only page numbers are required are presented as per the following: "Ahmed claims . . . (73)."
- All quotes should be enclosed by double quotation marks (""), except for quotes within quotes, which should be enclosed by single quotation marks ("'").
- If relevant to the review, mention your own experience and research which give you insight into the book's topic.
- At the end of your book review, please provide your preferred name for publication, your ORCID iD if you have one, and your email address for public correspondence.
- Please submit your book review to the Associate Editor within three months of receiving your book. Reviews are published online once copy-editing and proofreading are completed, and placed in the most appropriate print issue after submission.
- PRQ reviewers no longer receive print copies of the journal in which their reviews appear. You will be automatically notified and will receive a PDF when your review is made available online.
