- Are there recent (within 2-5 years) reviews on the topic you wish to cover? If so, present an argument, why another review is needed.

Text

- Is your Abstract 150-250 words in length? If longer, please shorten.
- Are your Acknowledgments to funding sources etc. mentioned (to be placed after “Conflict of Interest” – see below)?

Compliance with Ethical Standards

Have you included a “Compliance with Ethical Standards” section before the References as described in the Instructions for Authors “Compliance with Ethical Standards”, “Disclosure of potential conflicts of interest”, “Research involving human participants and/or animals” “Informed Consent”?

Compliance with Ethical Standards

Funding: *This study was funded by X (grant number X). (optional - could be left out in case no funding was received)*

Conflict of Interest: *Author1 declares that he/she has no conflict of interest.*

Author2 declares that he/she has no conflict of interest. ...

Ethical approval:

In case animals were involved:

If articles do not contain studies with human participants or animals by any of the authors, please select one of the following statements:

“This article does not contain any studies with human participants performed by any of the authors.”

or

“This article does not contain any studies with animals performed by any of the authors.”

or

This article does not contain any studies with human participants or animals performed by any of the authors.”

Informed consent: *“Informed consent was obtained from all individual participants included in the study.”*
