Instructions for Authors

Reference Style:

Citations:

Cite references in the text by name and year in parentheses. Cite references in chronological order (oldest first); within a given year, order them alphabetically.

Some examples:

One author: Marhold (1996), (Marhold 1996)

Two authors: Marhold and Lihová (2006), (Marhold and Lihová 2006)

Three and more authors: Španiel et al. (2011), (Španiel et al. 2011)

Same author, multiple citations: Marhold (1994, 1996), (Marhold 1994, 1996)

Same author, same date: Marhold (2013a,b), (Marhold 2013a,b)

Multiple citations: (Frajman and Oxelman 2007; Kolarčík et al. 2010; Hewitt 2011; Španiel et al. 2011a, b; Kučera et al. 2010, 2013)

Manuscripts accepted for publication but not yet published: Smith (in press), (Smith in press)

Unpublished data and manuscripts: P. Meredá and I. Hodálová (submitted/in prep./unpublished data), (P. Meredá and I. Hodálová submitted/in prep./unpublished data)

Personal communications: K. Marhold (personal comm./observation), (K. Marhold personal comm./observation)

Reference list:

The list of references should only include works that are cited in the text and that have been published or accepted for publication. Verify all entries against original sources. Double check that all references in the manuscript text are in the References and vice-versa and that they agree in spelling and year.

Unpublished data and manuscripts and personal communications are not included in References. Do not use footnotes or endnotes as a substitute for a reference list.

Reference list entries should be arranged alphabetically based on the surname of the first or sole author in year order. Where an author has more than one paper in the same year, these should be ordered with single authored papers first followed by two-author papers (ordered first alphabetically based on the second author's surname, then by year), and then any three-or-more-author papers (in year order only). Italicized letters a, b, c, etc., should be added to the date of papers with the same first authorship and year. Names of all authors should be provided (if given in the original work).

Always use the standard abbreviation of a journal's name according to B-P-H (Bridson GDR, 2004, BPH-2: Periodicals with Botanical Content. Hunt Institute for Botanical Documentation, Pittsburgh, available at: <http://fmhibd.library.cmu.edu/HIBD-DB/bpho/findrecords.php>). Titles and standard abbreviations of journals can be checked at <http://www.ipni.org/> as well.

For a paper or book printed in non-Roman scripts provide an English translation of the title (state original language in square brackets; e.g., [In Chinese]) and romanized form of authors' names, book publisher's name and place, or journal's title if given in original source.

For a paper or book printed entirely in Cyrillic, authors' names, title, book publisher's name and place, or journal's title have to be transliterated in accordance with ALA-LC (Library of Congress) transliteration (<http://www.loc.gov/catdir/cpsol/roman.html>) without diacritics (e.g., ie, e, ts, iu, ia use instead è, ë, ts, iu, ia).

For a paper or book printed entirely in alphabets other than Roman or Cyrillic (e.g. Arabic, Chinese, Japanese) provide the transliterated authors' names, book publisher's name and place, or journal's title in accordance with ALA-LC (Library of Congress) transliteration (<http://www.loc.gov/catdir/cpsol/roman.html>) and provide English translation of the title (state original language in square brackets; e.g., [In Chinese]).

Provide publishers for all books or omit them for books published before 1930.

Please provide doi if available.

The format of references in the References section should conform to the following styles:
