

# Guidelines for Authors of *Siberian Mathematical Journal*

*Siberian Mathematical Journal* accepts manuscripts containing new results in the field of mathematics. Review articles are not published. The editorial board does not consider manuscripts that have been previously published or submitted for publication elsewhere. The editorial board retains the right to refuse consideration of an article if it does not fit the scope of *Siberian Mathematical Journal* or if the portfolio is overloaded.

The submission should include the manuscript of no more than 60 000 characters or 18 journal pages), a cover letter stating that the manuscript is sent to *Siberian Mathematical Journal*, and information about the author(s) indicating full name, complete postal address for correspondence, affiliations with complete addresses, e-mail addresses, and phone numbers. Manuscripts with more than 60 000 characters are generally not considered, but may be taken into consideration and published only by special decision of the editorial board. Together with the manuscript, the authors should submit a completed, signed, and scanned copy of the [copy-right transfer agreement](#).

The manuscript can be presented as a PS or PDF file.

The length of 60 000 characters is approximately a  $\text{\TeX}$  file of 55 KB (for texts containing a small amount of the formulas, it may be up to 60 KB), 20 pages of text prepared using Microsoft Word, or 30–35 pages (depending on occupancy) of typescript text.

The manuscript is accompanied by a brief abstract (without formulas) and a list of keywords. Manuscripts containing figures will be accepted for publication only after the editorial board has clarified technical details on the implementation of figures. Computer-prepared graphics should be of high resolution (at least 600 dpi); do not use Adobe fonts that are not included in the  $\text{\MiKTeX}$  package.

The list of references is placed after the text. References to publications in the text are numbered in order of their appearance and should be in square brackets. References to unpublished works are not allowed. The list of references should be prepared according to the requirements of the journal (consult the latest issues of *Siberian Mathematical Journal* for the proper format of references).

A manuscript accepted for consideration is sent for peer review. Based on the review, the editorial board makes a decision on publication, which is reported to the author. The author has the right to communicate his comments or objections to the reviewer. The decision of the editorial board on the manuscript is final.

If a manuscript is accepted for publication after revision, the author should submit its latest version to the editorial board. When preparing the file, the  $\text{\AMS-TeX}$  macropackage should be used, as a rule, with an  $\text{\amspt}$  style file. Files in  $\text{\TeX}$  or  $\text{\LaTeX}$  formats may be submitted only with consent of the editorial board. The author should not use optional custom command sequences introduced to facilitate typing. It is forbidden to override Greek letters, standard commands, etc. Do not use space marks or other special formatting commands without the need. Proofs are sent to authors after editorial processing immediately prior to publication. They should be read, corrected (corrections to the original author version are undesirable), and re-sent to the editorial board as early as possible. Manuscripts are published only after the proofs signed by the authors for publication have been received.

In accordance with international copyright law, the editorial board notifies the authors of their responsibility to obtain, if needed, written permission to use copyrighted materials such as quotes, data reproduction, illustrations, and any other information that can be used in their publications, as well as the fact that consequent responsibility for violation of copyright laws lies with the authors. There are no charges nor royalties for publication.
