

Guidelines for Authors of *Biophysics*

Biophysics is a peer-reviewed journal that publishes new original experimental and theoretical data, as well as reviews. Short communications containing new data requiring rapid publication may also be submitted to the journal. The journal is published six times per year under the supervision of the Russian Academy of Sciences and Institute of Cell Biophysics of the Russian Academy of Sciences. The focus of the journal is molecular biophysics, cell biophysics, and biophysics of complex systems.

The manuscript must be accompanied by a completed copyright transfer agreement. The blank for copyright transfer agreement can be downloaded from the [publishers's website](#). The agreement enters into force if and when the manuscript is accepted for publication. Accompanying documents should be sent in digital form. The completed copyright transfer agreement should be scanned and e-mailed to the editorial board. If the manuscript makes use of previously published data (figures, tables, schemes, etc.), it should be accompanied by the written permission of the copyright owner. A cover letter should also accompany each manuscript.

The ethics policy of *Biophysics* implies that falsification and fabrication of data, plagiarism, and self-plagiarism are not acceptable.

Manuscripts that are not prepared in accordance with these guidelines may be returned to the authors without peer review and consideration by the editorial board.

Format of Manuscripts

- I. Each manuscript and all of the accompanying documents should be submitted by e-mail (biofizika@psn.ru). Files should be compressed into an archive. The text should be prepared in Microsoft Word.
- II. The following structure of the manuscript is recommended: title; list of authors; authors' affiliations, including address; e-mail addresses for correspondence; abstract; keywords (no more than six); list of abbreviations used in the manuscript; text of the article with standard sections (Introduction, Materials and Methods, Results, Discussion, Conclusions, and Acknowledgments); list of references; tables (numbered using Arabic numerals in the order they appear in the text); list of figure captions; figures (numbered using Arabic numerals in the order they appear in the text). Full contact details of the corresponding author should be submitted as a separate file (address, phone number, and e-mail address).
- III. Electronic versions of figures should be submitted in JPEG or TIFF format. Figures prepared in Corel Draw are also acceptable. If the quality of images does not fit the journal format, the manuscript may be returned for improvement. Color figures can be reproduced in the print version of the journal only in grayscale.
- IV. Mathematical formulas should be typed in the editor embedded in Microsoft Word. It is recommended to use exponent presentation instead of the mathematical "root" symbol. Each new formula should be given on a new line and numbered on the right-hand side of the page.
- V. Chemical structural formulas should be numbered by Roman numerals in parentheses in the order they appear in the text.
- VI. Units of measure must comply with the International System of Units (SI).
- VII. The captions of figures and tables should be sufficient to interpret them without additional information in the text.

- VIII. References in the text should be presented in square brackets and numbered sequentially as they appear in the text. If a reference is in a figure caption, its number also should correspond to the logical ordering in the article.

Upon Acceptance

- I. Only the results of completed research are considered by the editorial board. Every manuscript is subjected to peer review. Minor corrections to spelling, nomenclature or formatting can be made by the editor without an author's consent.
- II. If the text or graphics requires substantial corrections, the manuscript will be returned to the authors for revision. If the revised manuscript is received by the editorial board within three months from the date of primary decision, the date of first submission is indicated in the printed version.
- III. When corrections recommended by the editor are made, the improved manuscript should be sent to the editorial board with a letter that describes all of the corrections.
- IV. The editorial board reserves the right to reject a manuscript for the following reasons:
 1. The scientific content of the paper is outside the journal scope.
 2. The aims of the research are not clearly stated.
 3. The language and logic of presentation make the content of the manuscript unclear.
 4. The format of the manuscript does not meet the journal requirements.
 5. Ethical guidelines are not met.
