

## Prerequisites for Publication

### Editorial policy

The International Journal of Clinical Oncology (IJCO) welcomes original research papers on all aspects of clinical oncology that report the results of novel and timely investigations. Reports on clinical trials are encouraged. Experimental studies will also be accepted if they have obvious relevance to clinical oncology. Membership in the Japan Society of Clinical Oncology is not a prerequisite for submission to the journal. Papers are received on the understanding that: their contents have not been published in whole or in part elsewhere; that they are subject to peer review by at least two referees and the Editors, and to editorial revision of the language and contents; and that the Editors are responsible for their acceptance, rejection, and order of publication. Submission of papers translated into English from articles published in another language is not allowed. Secondary publication of an article published in IJCO in a language other than English is acceptable, provided all the conditions stipulated in "Acceptable Secondary Publication" in Uniform Requirements for Manuscripts Submitted to Biomedical Journals ([www.icmje.org/](http://www.icmje.org/)) are met.

### Ethical considerations

Papers on studies involving human subjects must be accompanied by a statement that the research was carried out according to the principles set out in the Declaration of Helsinki 1964 and all subsequent revisions, informed consent was obtained, and the relevant institutional review board had approved the study. This statement must appear in the Patients and methods section of the manuscript.

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All of the forms from each author need to be uploaded online and submitted with the manuscript at the time of submission by the corresponding author. Certify that all financial and material support for this research and work are clearly identified **in a separate sheet** as follows.
