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Title Page

The title page should include:

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Please provide an abstract of 150 to 250 words. The abstract should not contain any undefined abbreviations or unspecified references.

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Please provide 4 to 6 keywords which can be used for indexing purposes.

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All manuscripts should employ Canadian spelling (for example: colour, centre, flavour, favourite)

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- Use the equation editor or MathType for equations.
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Abbreviations

Abbreviations should be defined at first mention and used consistently thereafter.

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Footnotes or endnotes should not be used.

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Acknowledgments of people, grants, funds, etc. should be placed in a separate section on the title page. The names of funding organizations should be written in full.

Citation

Cite references in the text by name and year in parentheses. Some examples:

- Negotiation research spans many disciplines (Thompson, 1990).
- This result was later contradicted by Becker and Seligman (1996).
- This effect has been widely studied (Abbott, 1991; Barakat et al., 1995; Kelso & Smith, 1998; Medvec et al., 1999).

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The list of references should only include works that are cited in the text and that have been published or accepted for publication. Personal communications and unpublished works should only be mentioned in the text. Do not use footnotes or endnotes as a substitute for a reference list.
