

### Article Type: ASO Research Letter

#### Mission and Purpose

ASO Research Letters concisely summarize original surgical oncology research, supported by to-the-point data and core references.

The purpose of ASO Research Letters is to provide a forum for rapid publication of original research findings in an abbreviated format. Focused translational, clinical, and health services research findings that are novel, intriguing, timely, and/or noteworthy will be considered. Appropriate content would include meaningful research findings that are not strictly preliminary, yet not comprehensive enough for a full manuscript. Research findings should be important enough and of sufficient interest to the readership to warrant rapid communication.

#### Goals

- Provide rapid publication of high-quality summarized research relevant to surgical oncology
- Offer an article format that is suitable for full-length manuscripts to be revised into a short, succinct format
- Publish findings in a format that is appealing to readers

#### Format and Structure

ASO Research Letters text should be divided into the following sections: Introduction, Methods, Results, and Discussion with citations included. As for full-length articles, the Equator for Health Research Reporting website should be consulted and a completed study guideline checklist should accompany the submission.

#### *ASO Research Letter Specifications:*

Word limit: 600 words maximum excluding references

Byline: up to 7 authors

Abstract: not included

References: 6 maximum

Figures/tables: 2 maximum

Supplemental materials: optional

Companions: will not have companion editorials, ASO Reflections, or Visual/Video Abstracts
